The School Board does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, ethnicity, religion, national origin, sex (including sexual orientation, transgender status, or gender identity), disability (including HIV, AIDS, or sickle cell trait), pregnancy, marital status, age (except as authorized by law), ancestry, genetic information, which are classes protected by State and/or Federal law (collectively, "protected classes") in its programs and activities, including employment opportunities. Equal access to facilities is also provided to the Boy Scouts and other patriotic youth groups, as required by the Boy Scouts of America Equal Access Act. It is the legal obligation and the policy of the Board to employ only those persons who are best qualified, with or without reasonable accommodations. The Superintendent shall appoint a compliance officer whose responsibility it will be to require that Federal and State regulations are complied with and that any inquiries or complaints are dealt with promptly in accordance with law. S/He shall also require that proper notice of nondiscrimination for Title II, Title VI, and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendment Act of 1972, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and the Age Discrimination in Employment Act will be provided to staff members and the general public. Any sections of the District's collectively bargained negotiated agreements dealing with hiring and promotion will contain a statement of nondiscrimination similar to that in the Board's statement above.

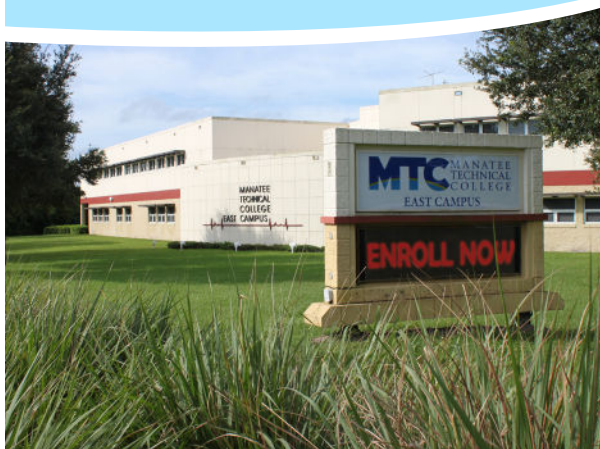

Our Partnership Programs

Advisory Committee

As members of MTC's Advisory Committee, local business and community leaders with expertise in specific career fields provide advice and assistance to our instructors and administrators. Committee members meet twice a year to make recommendations and improvements to programs to which they are aligned.

Allied Health Externships

A critical part of training for students enrolled in our Allied Health programs is the externship and on the job (OJT) experience. Students make a real contribution to an organization's productivity and affiliated health care providers can create an on-going pipeline of future employees. Having an externship program is a great way to try out talent before bringing healthcare graduates on as full-time employees.

Cooperative Education Training

Students who have completed 70% of their program competencies are permitted to be employed in the Industrial Cooperative Education and Business Cooperative Education (ICE/BCE) on-the-job training program. Students develop communication skills, real-world hands-on training and employability/soft skills needed to secure a position in the workforce.

The Career Board is accessible online and is a resource for our business partners and the community at large. Local employers can showcase their employment opportunities to our instructors, students, recent graduates and as well as all community job seekers.
